

POSTAL VOTING Explanatory Notice

In order to be taken into account, postal votes must have been delivered by post to the establishment by the date of the count, which is

Tuesday 8 April for the 1st round

before the polling stations close (4.30 pm)

In your envelope, you will find:

- this **explanatory notice**
- a **letter addressed to voters**
- an **extract from the rules and regulations governing elections**
- a **freepost ('T') envelope** bearing the address of the Elections Office
- an **envelope** referred to as '**envelope No. 2**' on which are shown your full name and electoral college
- a **manilla 'kraft' envelope** containing the voting papers:
 - for the **Board of Directors (CA): GREEN** voting papers
 - Envelope No. 1-CA
 - Ballot papers
 - Professions of faith for each candidate, where available
 - for the **Training Board (CF): BLUE** voting papers
 - Envelope No. 1-CF
 - Ballot papers
 - Professions of faith for each candidate, where available
 - and for the **Scientific Board (CS): PINK-BEIGE** voting papers
 - Envelope No. 1-CS
 - Ballot papers
 - Professions of faith for each candidate, where available

Stages of the vote:

Stage 1

You should put the ballot papers into **envelope No. 1** corresponding to voting for the Board of Directors, the Training Board and where applicable, the Scientific Board.

NB: you can put into the voting envelope (n°1-CA, n°1-CF and where applicable n°1-CS) fewer ballot papers than there are seats to be filled for the college in which you vote.

However, if you put in more ballot papers than there are seats to be filled for the college in which you vote, your vote will be considered null.

Stage 2

You should then put each of these envelopes (No.1-CA, No.1-CF and where applicable No.1-CS) in the envelope referred to as **envelope No.2**, on which you must imperatively fill out the sections entitled: Last name, first name, college, round of ballot.

Please note, your signature is compulsory if your vote is to be taken into account.

Stage 3

Lastly, you should put envelope No.2 into the **'T' envelope**, which you must return without delay.
