

Université Sorbonne Paris Cité International Masters Mobility Scholarship (USPC-MIEM) program

In 2015-2016, 200 **USPC -MIEM** scholarships will be offered to international students in their master's 1st or 2nd year, including 13 for EHESP students.

In line with the Idex programme priorities and the University's 2014-2018 policy agreement, USPC has made of the international dimension of teaching and research one of its priorities. The **International Masters Mobility Scholarship (MIEM) programme** at USPC aims at bringing an international approach to a limited number of Masters courses chosen by USPC, by awarding scholarships to international students, in first or second year.

After their master, MIEM scholars will be able to apply to USPC international doctoral contracts, according to their academic results.

USPC therefore creates a process that fosters the training of international experts in science who will in the future become senior officials in their countries of origin.

EHESP has chosen to select 3 masters for which 13 scholarships (amount of 10 000€ each) will be awarded in total :

- Master of public health (program in Paris <http://www.mph.ehesp.fr> and also in the framework of the double degree Europubhealth <http://www.europubhealth.org/>, specialization in environmental and occupational health sciences)
- Master in administration of public health policies and programs (in the framework of Europubhealth double degree <http://www.europubhealth.org/>)
- Master public health and environmental risks

MIEM 2015/2016 application form will be directly sent to students selected to those masters who respond to the following criteria.

Eligibility criteria (students can only apply to masters included in USPC-MIEM program):

- To be an international student integrating the first year of the master
- Or to have already obtained a USPC MIEM scholarship in the first year of the master and to register for the second year
- Or to be an international student and enter the second year of the master (not having done the 1st year in France at the date of the application)
- Additionally, for candidates entering the MPH program, to be citizen of a middle or low income country * (priority will be given to citizen from a country listed in the EHESP and/or USPC international strategy: Argentina, Brazil, Burkina Faso, China, Morocco, Vietnam)

N.B: a pilot procedure is applied to MIEM 2014/2015 scholars.

Scholarship selection:

A selection committee chaired by the International Relations Department will meet including: the Head of the master program, representatives from the Doctoral Network in public health animated by EHESP, and the Registrar's Office. The selection criteria will include:

- The excellence of academic results: This will be evaluated through documentation required for the Master application process
- The potential to pursue studies at PhD level or to take high responsibilities in public health in the home country.
