

A scientific literature review of job inclusion and job retention practices

Relevant work-package:

Work-package 1: Initiatives for helping people with disabilities into work and retain a job

Project summary:

The solutions – in terms of inclusion and job retention- likely to address the issue of people with disabilities in the labour market do not seem, at the present state, to have been the object of research, in France and in particular within the public sector. The objective of this project is to provide an overview of a compendium of knowledge and of current practices in regards to this issue. A French and international scientific literature review will thus be conducted concerning these practices. We will not initially single out the public sector as there is little published literature about it (Hirst et al., 2004). We will however examine this sector at a later stage. The *Academic search* and *CINAHL* (via the *Ebscohost* platform) databases as well as the those of publishers *Science Direct-Elsevier* and *SAGE* and the platforms *Revues.org* and *Cairn.info*, will be systematically explored from the year 2000 onwards. The bibliographical lists of the selected articles will be explored in order to complete our scientific literature, wherever necessary.
